A PRAYER METHOD

Praying With Sacred Objects The Baptismal Font.

Introduction;

- ✓ This prayer method consists of reflecting and praying on sacred objects found in our Churches and Temples.
- ✓ <u>They are objects set aside to be used only for the worship of God and the dispensation of the Sacraments.</u> That's why we call them "Sacred Objects"
- ✓ <u>The most important ones are</u>: **The Baptismal Font, the Altar, the Tabernacle, the** Confessional and the Lectern
- ✓ <u>Lesser ones are</u>: The Ciborium, The Chalice, The Monstrance, Candles, The Holy Water Font and still others.
- ✓ God disposed that we should use visible material objects as symbols and helps to reach Him the Invisible, the Spiritual Supreme Being
- ✓ By using these objects in faith God becomes present and active in us.
- ✓ This prayer method is better done within the Church's premises:

PROCEDURE

!st. Part. Setling Down.

- Enter the Church Building; preferably, in a quiet moments, when there are neither crowds, nor services going on. A silent and prayerful atmosphere is wanted.
- For a while, sit, stand or kneel all alone by yourself.
- Quiet down. Relax.
- Ask the Holy Spirit to help you to pray.
- In silence go around the Church and observe attentively the five most significant Sacred Objects laying there: The Baptismal Font, TheAltar, The Tabernacle. The Confessional and the Lectern.
- Keep looking at them. Ask yourself: What do these objects remind me of?
- Be aware of the thoughts and feelings arising within you.
- From the objects mentioned, choose one that appeals to you at that moment.
- In silence, come close to that object and keep looking at it.
- As an instance of this method of prayer, we have chosen "The Baptismal Font" (For future exercises you may choose other holy objects)

2nd part: Reflection and Prayer

- Come close to the Baptismal Font.
- Remember what happened to you over here
- As a baby, in this place, Jesus called you to Himself. Think pray and thank God.
- Here, you received Baptism. Think, pray and thank God.
- Here, you became a Christian, a Member of God's family. Think, pray and thank God.
- Here; God accepted you as his beloved child. Think, pray and thank God.
- Here, through your God-parents you accepted God as your Heavenly Father. Rejoice over it and thanked God for it.
- Have you behaved like a true child of God from that moment on? Have you been a Christ-like person? Examine your life.
- Have you ever wronged or disowned God, your Father, by sin? If so, say sorry to Him.
- Remember the many good things you did in your life as a disciple of Jesus. <u>Thank God for helping you to do them.</u>
- Call to mind the promises you made, long ago, at the Baptismal Font. Renew them now..
- Will you strive to keep them, more faithfully, from today? Reflect. How?
- Finally, come closer to the Font. Touch it. Feel it with love and gratefulness. Kiss it. This Font is sort of a divine womb where you were born a child to God.
- Remain for a while in prayerful silence. Be aware of your feelings.
- Do you remember the date of your Baptism?
- Have you ever celebrated it as the greatest and happiest day of your life the day, you became a child of God? Begin celebrating it from now on.
- Has God blessed you being a Dad or a Mum to some children? What example, what values have you imparted to your kids, whom you got baptized over here? <u>Check on yourself.</u>
- Have you given them an example of true Christian living? How to improve the quality of Christian life in your home? <u>Reflect and take action.</u>

Closure:

- Thank God for calling you to be a member of his family
- Ask God for his help and blessings.
- Then, make your mind to live up to "Your Baptismal Promises".
- Finally, recite "The I Believe" and "The Our Father"
- You may sing an appropriate hymn.
